

## Statement

Relating to the removal of **Pigeon fouling waste**

### Public Health Risks

Prior to any treatment, a survey will be carried out. The survey will consider where a risk to public health may occur and what actions need to be taken to prevent or minimise the risk. In many cases this will be without the need for a written appraisal. Survey and Treatment reports will be issued following each site visit

### Operational Health Risks-PPE

A risk to health will occur when handling the product at several different stages throughout the operation.

When carrying out the following PPE should be worn:

Synthetic rubber gloves or PVC gloves.

Disposable coveralls.

Hardhat

Safety boots

Respirators, goggles and high vis vest if required.

### Method of use

A mental risk assessment will be carried out prior to any treatment; weather conditions members of public buildings, animals, electricity etc.

1.Initially the fouling will be sprayed with a biocide, which will minimize dust particles and air born bacteria associated with the fouling.

2.The fouling and nesting material will then be removed with scrapper and brushes, which will be placed and tied in bags.

3.The waste will be removed from site and disposed of under the correct waste regulations.

4.Second biocide treatment to be carried out to all the affected areas.
